# STACEY WAYNE

**SITKA HS**  
**Debate, Drama**  
**& Forensics**

Stacey Wayne started coaching and teaching drama at Sitka High in 1987 and took two students to the state championship event in that inaugural year. The next year she was able to add debate resulting in the school's first DDF team.

With the help of talented assistants, Wayne developed a powerful program that led to more than 40 individual and team state titles in her 25-year coaching career. Her prowess led to the state DDF event being held in Sitka in 2010 when she was named the coach of the year.

“(Wayne’s) dedication to the Drama, Debate, & Forensics activity is evident in the lasting legacy she built and the impact she had on all her students,” said current Sitka coach Christian Litten. “She engaged in a way I hadn’t known other teachers to do and helped push me to be a strong actor and public speaker when I was a student.

Wayne calls her proudest accomplishment knowing all the students she coached and mentored who’ve continued to share their DDF talent passion through coaching themselves. Her coaching tree has branched out all over the state – to Anchorage, Metlakatla, Mount Edgecumbe, Skagway and elsewhere.





# ALLIE OSTRANDER

**KENAI-CENTRAL HS  
XCR, Track & Field,  
Soccer, Basketball**

Before graduating from Kenai Central High in 2015, Allie Ostrander played some basketball and soccer. Oh, she also ran – about as dominantly well as anyone before, during or after her time as an Alaska high school legend.

Not only did Ostrander win the Nike Cross Country National Championship as a senior, she left for her storied collegiate career at Boise State as one of the most sought-after high school stars in the nation. She earned 10 state titles over a four-year span as a Kardinal, won 36 of the 40 races she competed in during her senior year of track and field. Ostrander's time of 9 minutes, 58.74 second in the 3,200 meters registered as the second-best high school time in the country. She was named Gatorade Player of the Year four times, totaled four school records in track and pieced together six titles in Alaska's famed Mount Marathon race.

"Allie is a perfectionist, determined to be the best at everything she does and has done," said Stacia Rustad, a veteran coach. "Allie was kind and supportive to all her teammates, she was a complete competitor and made her teammates around her better." Ostrander is currently an assistant cross-country coach at Seattle Pacific. She also recently announced a return to the professional running ranks with NNormal, a company co-founded by fellow Mount Marathon winner Kilian Jornet.



# ARMAND RUFFIN

CHUGIAK HS

Basketball, Football,  
Track & Field

Armand Ruffin's accolades are many. "Armand was undoubtedly the best overall athlete to ever wear a Chugiak Mustangs' uniform," legendary coach Tom Huffer Sr. said.

Ruffin excelled in basketball, football and track and field before graduating from the school in 1987. He earned a total of 10 varsity letters, plus all-state honors in all the sports as both a junior and senior, and helped lead the Mustangs to a track state championship as a senior. He was also named the Gatorade Player of the Year.

"Armand was not only an outstanding athlete, his character was above reproach in regard to his work ethic," said longtime Alaska educator K Scott Daugharty. "Behind in formal schooling when he arrived in Alaska, he consistently worked in class to catch up with his classmates.

"His uncle also required Armand to work in his janitorial business 20-40 hours a week depending on Armand's schedule, and this work ethic has served Armand well in later life." Ruffin currently resides in Tacoma, Wash., where he works in school security and coaches basketball, football and track.





# BRANDON DRUMM

**SERVICE HS  
Football,  
Track & Field**

Starting in Brandon Drumm's junior season, and especially during his senior season, the Service High football team played with the clearest of vision. The Cougars saw fit to give Drumm the ball – a lot – while Alaska eyeballed arguably the greatest performance by a running back in state history.

A 1998 Service graduate, Drumm rushed for nearly 4,000 yards as a junior and senior, and the Cougars capped off his career with an 11-0 record and 1997 First National Bowl title. He ran for a state single-game record 368 yards in a game against Juneau the previous year and scored nine touchdowns in that game.

As a senior, Drumm was named the state player and Gatorade player of the year. Sports Illustrated included him as one of Alaska's 50 greatest sports figures in 1999. He also lettered multiple times in track and field.

Drumm enjoyed success as a fullback during his collegiate career at the University of Colorado and was drafted by the NFL's Detroit Lions. Today, Drumm resides in Anchorage with his wife BreeAnna and four children and is a successful small-business owner.



# IZABELLE ITH

**PETERSBURG HS**  
**Swimming,**  
**Track & Field**

Izabelle Ith proved time and time again to be a successful, award-winning leader both athletically and academically.

Ith earned varsity letters in both swimming and track and field during all four years of high school at Petersburg. She graduated in 2017 with a 4.0 grade-point average. She was her senior class' valedictorian and a three-year National Honor Society member. Athletically, Ith won four state track titles in the 100-meter hurdles and triple jump and two in the 300 hurdles and long jump. She was Petersburg's first Gatorade Player of the Year in 2017 for track and field. She qualified for the state swim meet four times as well.

"On the track at the long jump pit, an official nicknamed Izabelle the 'Rocket Girl,' and rocket she did," said former Petersburg coach Brad Taylor. "There has been no athlete I've coached in the last 40 years that's worked harder or dedicated themselves more than Izabelle."

Collegiately at Williams College, Ith was twice named a NCAA All-America honoree. Today, she works for Boston Children's Hospital and has continued to be an athlete, competing in triathlons and half marathons. She is also a member of the Boston Children's Hospital running club.



# JOSH GEMMELL

**SOLDOTNA HS**  
**Swimming**

A 2001 Soldotna High graduate, Joshua Gemmell's efforts in a swimming pool led to many a memorable moment, including a captivating performance at the 2000 state high school championships.

It was during that meet Gemmell won all four of his events – 100-yard freestyle and breaststroke and two relays – and was named the outstanding competitor. He established a state record, broke three school records and helped the Stars finish second in the team standings. He finished with five school records.

"It was a great accomplishment because we weren't a one-person team," Gemmell said. "The entire team contributed, and everyone stepped up under pressure.

The previous year, Gemmell won the same two individual races at the state meet. He lettered four times in swimming at Soldotna and three times in soccer. He swam collegiately at the Arizona State University

"An outstanding person and a great leader in and out of the pool," former Soldotna coach Sohail Marey said of Gemmell. "As a high school swimmer, he was always a star."



# MILO GRIFFIN

**BEN EIELSON, LATHROP  
& WEST VALLEY HS**  
Baseball, Basketball, Tennis,  
Football, Track & Field

A Fairbanks staple for more than six decades, Milo Griffin should be as familiar to Alaskans as he was to always holding rolled-up papers in his hands along the basketball sidelines while coaching.

From 1966-69, Griffin set many University of Alaska Fairbanks records as a player and was the school's all-time leading scorer for 36 years.

Griffin was a part of UAF's first induction class of the Nanook Hall of Fame in 2008. He was the first player to have a number retired by the Nanooks, the number 44 that hangs in the Patty Center Gym. He also played for the Alaska Goldpanners for multiple seasons.

Coaching mainly at Lathrop High, the number of students he helped guide through sports and life is astronomic. In 35 years leading basketball teams, he secured state tournament berths 33 times. He also coached baseball, softball, tennis and track and field. He'd be the coach if a team needed one.

"Milo has made a lasting impact on Alaska athletes both on and off the field and court," said Regis University women's basketball assistant coach Jessie Craig. "One would be hard pressed to find an athlete in Alaska during all these years who hasn't been impacted by him."



# ROBERT RYCHNOVSKY

**NEWHALEN HS  
Basketball**

The fact Bob Rychnovsky started coaching at Newhalen High in the late 70's is enough to earn admiration from all corners. Thriving for that long a period in the small village 200 air miles southwest of Anchorage makes his career accomplishment more impressive.

"As you well know, most of rural Alaska's school districts struggle to keep their teachers for more than a few years," said Steve Atwater, a University of Alaska administrator and dean. "In response to this personnel churn, rural students may be reluctant to fully trust their teacher and as a result, often approach school in a passive way.

"Bob's 44-year commitment to Newhalen School and the communities of Newhalen and Iliamna is exemplary and allowed him to assume an enormous level of trust and respect by generations of Newhalen students."

During his tenure, Rychnovsky made Newhalen a reputable basketball program at Alaska's 1A level, the classification for the state's smallest schools. The Malemutes won the 2012 March Madness Alaska 1A state championship and have placed second four times.





# HAROLD WILSON

*Official*

*Anchorage - Football & Basketball*

In a 2019 proclamation from the Alaska Legislature, the creators did a stellar job of encapsulating Harold Wilson's lifetime of achievement in the military, the workforce and as a dedicated sports official.

"Harold has exemplified the best of those American values: humility, industriousness and selfless service," it reads. "Moreover, in his service to our country, and his community, whether that be in uniform, on the factory floor or in a striped jersey of a referee, (Wilson) models these values for the many adults and children he works with on a daily basis."

Wilson retired from the Air Force and began officiating basketball in 1978. He started out as a football ref a few years later and added flag football to his officiating resume nearly 20 years ago. He's worked as the president and member at large of the Anchorage Sports Officials Association, all while officiating too many meaningful conference and state games to count.

Wilson's volunteerism is worthwhile as well. He's helped secure sponsors and organize hospitality for ASAA's March Madness Alaska and been a Special Olympics Alaska advocate.

"Harold's positivity and zest for life have made others always want to work beside him," said Don Winchester, one of the state's top sports historians. "His passion for the profession and for helping our youth has been evident all these years."





# BILL STOLTZE

As an Alaska State Legislator, Bill Stoltze committed himself to championing efforts to improve the conditions of outdoor athletic fields all over Alaska. His leadership helped lead to artificial turf fields sprouting up in Anchorage, the Kenai Peninsula, the Matanuska-Susitna Valley and Southeast. The fields are utilized by physical education classes as well as baseball, football and soccer teams.

Stoltze is well known and respected for his support of youth activities. In his years as a legislator, he found ways to assist the Alaska School Activities Association when asked. For example, he found solutions to help sports officials and championed the “Play for Keeps, Win for Life” educational program. He helped make the University of Alaska Anchorage’s Alaska Airlines Center a reality.

“(Stoltze’s) vision and support have been instrumental in keeping youth and student sports and activities thriving in Alaska,” said Gary Matthews, retired ASAA executive director.

Stoltze has also been a longtime supporter of Special Olympics Alaska. He’s remained true to his Chugiak community, so much so the main meeting room in the Chugiak Senior Center is named “The Bill Stoltze Room” in his honor.

After outstanding accomplishments as a high school and college athlete, Rus Schreckenghost's marvelous career in coaching and teaching started in that order. He coached basketball, cross country and track and field for a few seasons before taking a job as a Dimond High math teacher in 1978.

Schreck, as he's affectionately known, hasn't slowed down since. He remains on the frontlines of all that is Alaska high school to this day as an Alaska School Activities Association associate director.

"Schreck and (Alaska) high school sports really are synonymous," said Mary (Pearce) Ahonen, a 2002 Dimond High graduate and decorated athlete. "Our state and our high schools would not be the same without him. I'm proud to call him a mentor."

Before joining ASAA in 2007, Schreckenghost excelled as an athletic director and organized many successful tournaments and meets. He's also been part of the Alaska Student Leadership Conference, an instructor for the Alaska Coaches Education Program and a Special Olympics Alaska volunteer.

"Schreck was supportive of what I wanted to do as an athlete," Ahonen said. "I'll never forget that."
